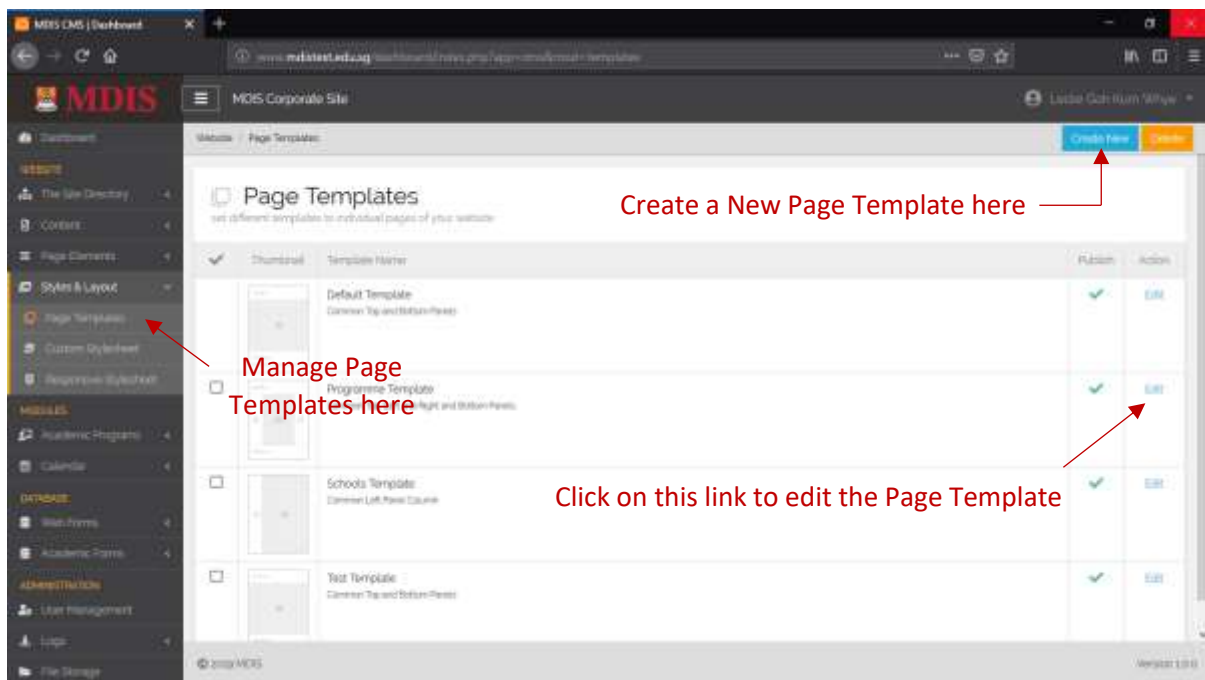


Page Templates

Page templates are master templates assigned to individual web pages so that common content (like submenus and breadcrumbs) are applied throughout the set of pages. You can create multiple page templates with different configurations.



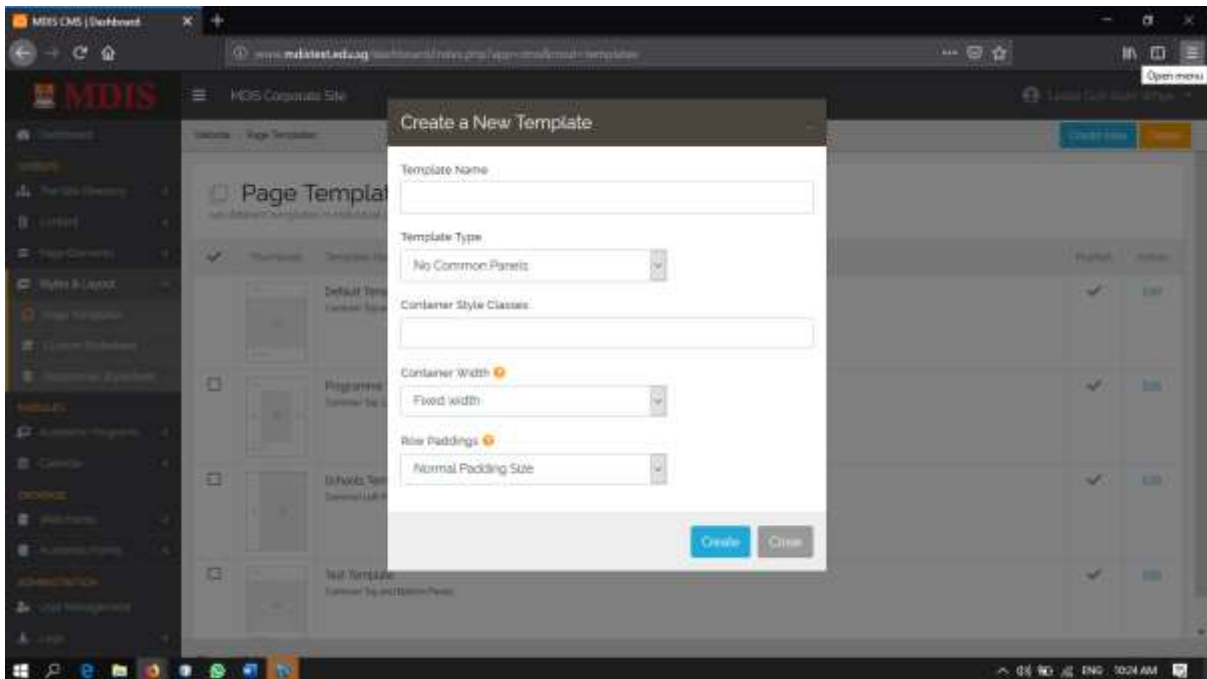
Page Template Configurations

The different template configurations are:

- No Common Panels
- Common Left Panel Column
- Common Right Panel Column
- Common Left and Right Panels
- Common Top Panel Banner
- Common Bottom Panel Footer
- Common Top and Left Panels
- Common Top and Right Panels
- Common Top and Bottom Panels
- Common Top, Left and Bottom Panels
- Common Top, Right and Bottom Panels
- Common Top, Left and Right and Bottom Panels

Creating A New Page Template

When the CREATE NEW button is clicked, a popup will appear. Simply fill in the required fields and click on the CREATE button on the popup.



Template Name	The name of this page template. It is recommended to key in a slightly more descriptive name for the TEMPLATE NAME field
Template Type	The template configuration given on the previous page
Common Style Classes	Add any common template level style classes
Container Width	Sets whether this template fits the entire screen (Fluid Width) or aligns to a Fixed Width
Row Paddings	Sets whether there are left and right paddings around the template

Once the template is created, there will be additional options that you can set for the template. This is covered in the following section.

Editing a Page Template

To edit a Page Template, simply click on the EDIT link. This redirects you to the Edit Page Template section. Please note that the options on this page follows the type of Configuration that you have selected for the Page Template.

For the purpose of this document, the Page Template has the **COMMON TOP AND LEFT PANELS** configuration.
